

Ribbed Sock for Blue Knifty Knitter Loom



I created the ribbed sock pattern for the fine gauge knitting looms, and I was asked to create it for the Blue Knifty Knitter Loom. I have not knitted it, but here are the instructions for it, if any of you knit it, please let me know.

The sock has ribbing on the leg, the heel is an hourglass heel created with short rows, the toe area is done with short rows also, just like the heel. Due to the large gauge the sock is more of a slipper sock, or a house sock, but I have made some changes to the pattern to make it snug on the foot. I altered the pattern to have the ribbing extended down to the foot area, however, having ribbing on the sole would make the sock uncomfortable, thus, I changed the pattern to have stockinette on the sole, while the ribbing on the instep will make the sock snug around the foot.

Materials:

- Blue Knifty Knitter Loom
- Yarn: 2 strands of Caron Simply Soft Yarn or 1 strand of Caron Simply Soft Quick
- Knitting Tool
- Tapestry Needle

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Pattern Notes:

- Use 2 strands of Caron Simply Soft throughout the pattern or
- Use 1 strand of Caron Simply Soft Quick
- Wrap & Turn: Lift the loop off the peg that needs wrapped, take the working yarn towards the inside of the loom, then wrap the peg. Place the loop back on the peg.
- When knitting over the pegs that have been wrapped, knit over 2 over 1 on those pegs.
- K=Knit single stitch with e-wrap, unless otherwise noted
- P=Purl

Pattern

Set up row: Cast on 24 pegs with the Cable Cast on Method.

Row 1: *K2, P2*, repeat from * to * to the end of the round

Row 2: Repeat Row 1, until leg measures 7" from the cast on edge.

Heel

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Foot Body

Row 1: Knit 12 stitches, Knit 1 *P2, K2* repeat from * to * one stitch before end of round, Knit 1.

Row 2: Repeat row 1 until the foot area measures 1.75 inches shy of the length desired.

Row 3: Knit 1 row of flat stitch

Toe

Repeat heel area, knit it with the **Flat Stitch**

Remove with the Flat Zig Zag removal method-as pictured below:

Cut yarn leaving a 24 inch tail, thread it through the darning needle. With the needle coming from the last peg worked for the toe, (assume it is peg 1)

Step 1: With needle, pass it through the loop on peg 1 take the stitch off the peg.

Step 2: Go to the peg to the left of peg 1, pass the needle through the loop and remove it off the peg

Step 3: Go to the right of peg 1 and take the loop off the peg.

Repeat Steps 1-3, alternating from right to left in a zig zag motion.



Final step: when all the loops have been removed and are threaded on the yarn, pull on the yarn gently to tighten the stitches. Pass the needle towards the inside of the loom and weave in your yarn tail end.

One sock done! Make another one 😊
